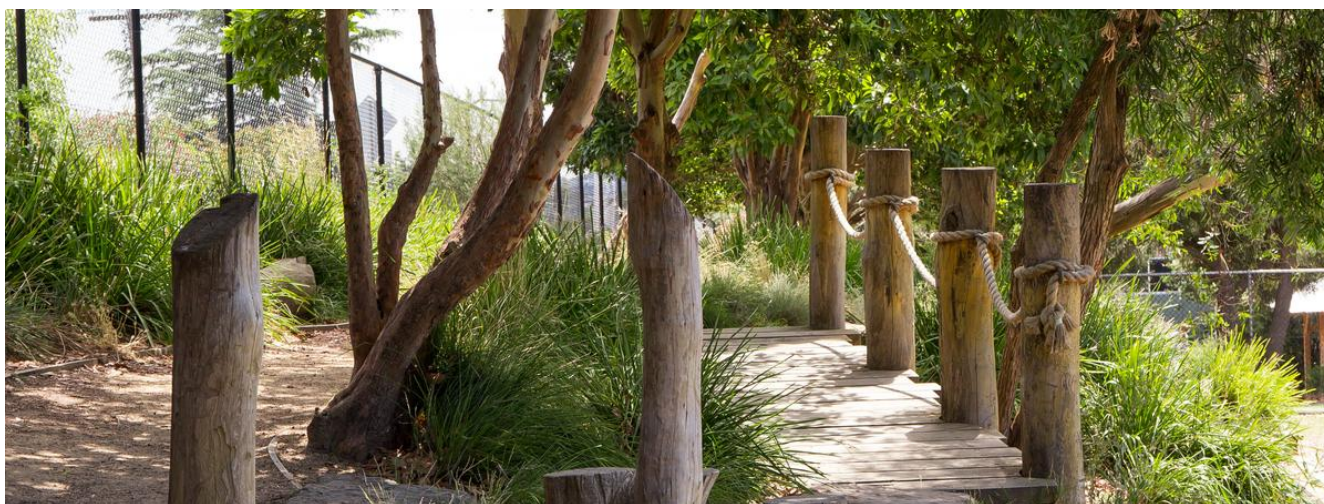

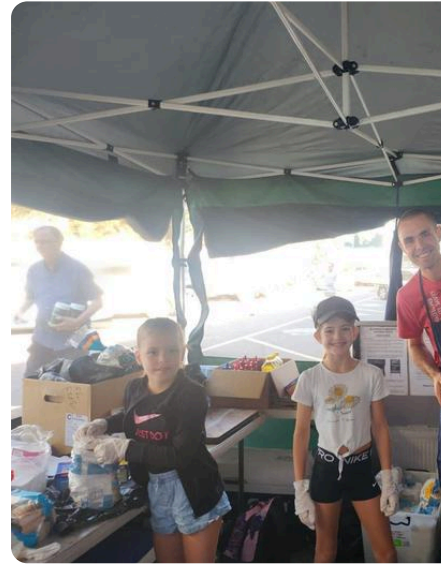

Many thanks to Will Weijers and his team of helpers who manned the BBQ at Bunnings Eltham. It was a huge success, raising over \$1700 for our new playground.



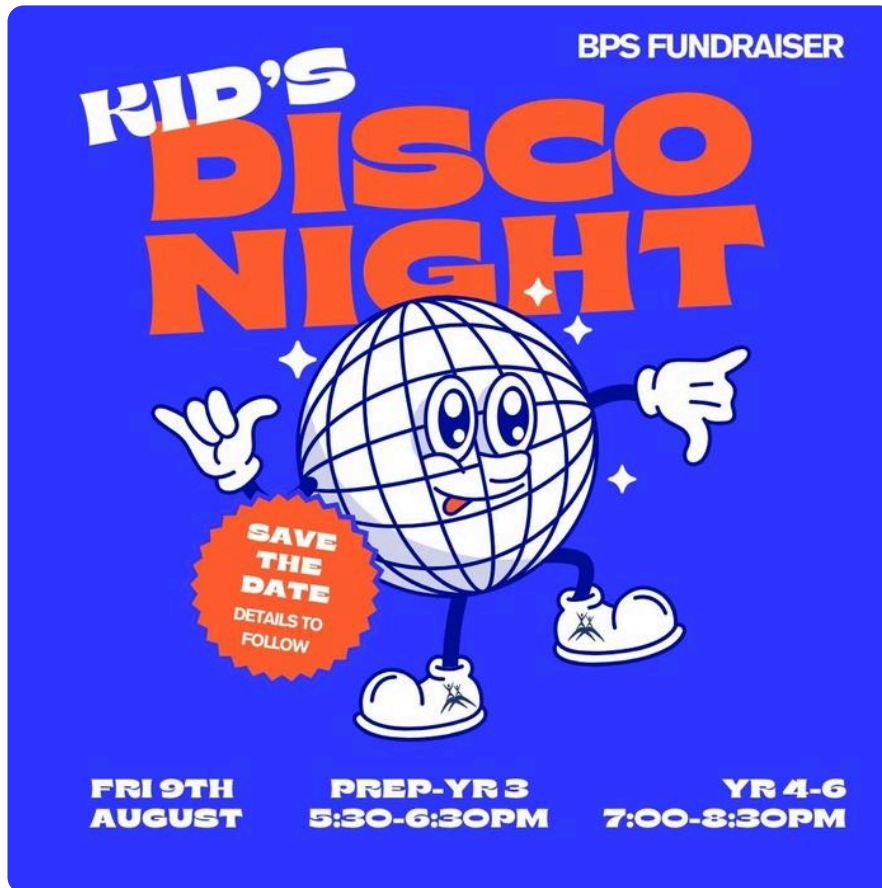


